
HOWZAT CHALLENGE

What is the cumulative distance your school can throw a ball and hit some wickets?

Rules

- Place one set of standard cricket stumps on the ground, ideally in the middle of a large space.
- Each child should be given a cone and a ball, ideally an orange kwik cricket ball, but a tennis ball can also be used. Nothing larger than this should be used.
- Finding a space, each child should put down the cone, stand behind it and throw their ball in an attempt to hit the stumps.
- They can choose to throw from whatever distance they choose. They can try as many times as they like and move their cone closer or further away.
- The ball can roll, bounce or directly hit the stumps.
- Should a throw hit the stumps, the distance should be measured from the stumps to the nearest edge of the cone. This should be rounded to the nearest 10 cm.
- The furthest distance in each year group should be added together, with the member of staff who can hit from the furthest distance too.
- The school with the furthest distance in each fixture will win.

For each round your school will compete against one other school. This will be different for each round. Points will be awarded depending if you win, lose or draw for that challenge.

How can we earn points for our school?

A school will be allocated the points in the league table each week. If a school wins the fixture they will be allocated 10 points; lose the fixture 2 points; draw the fixture 5 points.

An additional 10 bonus points are available to all schools each week by completing tasks and challenges. These could prove crucial in final league standings as the weeks progress.

When will the fixtures and competitions be announced?

Your school fixture will be announced when your school receives details of the next competition

What happens if we win the league?

A Trophy and a whole school event of your choice, will be awarded to the school who finishes at the Top of the League.
