The squad should consist of a minimum of seven and a maximum of nine players, with five on court at any one time. The 'on court' positions are GK, GS, GA, GD & C. Where possible, squad players not on court should take part in the various tasks to support the team, from the menu of off court roles. These are all aligned to the Bee Netball Beeliefs. You can choose which of the off court roles are most appropriate to the children you are involving. These can be found at https://d2cx26apfwuhvu.cloudfront.net/englandnetball/wp-content/uploads/2019/09/02155906/Menu-of-Off-Court-Roles-Stingers.pdf Only two boys are allowed on the court at the same time with a maximum of three boys in the squad. Substitutions may be made at any time in the event of illness or injury, but the boy / girl ratio should still apply where possible to do so.
Games can be split into either halves or quarters. This is determined by the number of entries received. If attending matches, all children must take to the court and the rotations enable this (unless illness or injury occurs). Rotations sheets are available to help staff organise these rotations
The game can be played on any netball court up to a maximum size of 30.5m x15.25m (100ft x 50ft). On smaller courts the centre (radius 0.9m (3ft)) and shooting circles (radius 4.9m (16ft)) should remain full size. Normal court markings should be used. The court should be level and flat. Make sure that there are no loose objects, such as grit or wet leaves, on or around the court which could cause injury.
Posts should be placed on the centre point of each goal line with none of the base protruding onto the court. The ring should be 2.74m (9ft) from the ground and fitted with a net. A size 4 Netball should be used. A player must pass or shoot within 4 seconds. Bibs: You can use the GS, GA, C, GD and GK from the full set of netball bibs.
